FIRST ENERGY

Individually Metered (Residential) Multifamily Program

First Energy of Pennsylvania offers low-income multifamily programs for building owners with tenants with limited incomes in each of its service territories (Met-Ed, Penelec, Penn Power, or West Penn Power). The program offers energy efficient direct-install measures, common area energy efficiency upgrades, and energy education workshops for tenants.

ELIGIBILITY

- Buildings with five or more units that are individually metered.
- Individual tenants can qualify if they are at or below 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines
- Must be serviced by Met-Ed, Penelec, Penn Power, or West Penn Power.
- For Common Areas:
 - Common areas measures are available for both master and individually metered buildings with five or more units. To qualify, a minimum of 66 percent of tenants must be at or below 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

AVAILABLE ENERGY EFFICIENCY ITEMS

For **individually metered buildings**, there is no cost to the owner or tenants for in-unit measures.

Individually Metered Energy-Efficient Upgrades

- Efficient lighting
- LED night lights
- Refrigerator/freezer evaluation and replacement
- Smart power strips
- Faucet aerators
- Shower heads
- Electric water heater inspection
- Furnace whistles

Common Area Energy-Efficient Upgrades

Common area upgrades can be performed during either the individually metered or master metered multifamily program.

This program pays for 80% of the cost of **each energy efficiency item installed**, leaving the landlord or building owner to pay the remaining 20%. This discounted price is upfront. There is not a rebate process.

Upgrades include:

- LED exit signs
- Efficient lighting
- Smart power strips
- Faucet aerators
- Electric water heater inspection
- Efficient vending machine sensors
- Occupancy sensors
- Energy education workshops







STEP-BY-STEP PROCESS

- 1. Contact Pam McMillen, the program manager, at 1.888.406.8074 to discuss eligibility.
- 2. Owner must complete and submit the Landlord Agreement.
- 3. Owner must send out the First Energy applications to their tenants. First Energy requires a minimum of 10% of the applications be returned in order to proceed (if less than 10% are returned, First Energy will direct the owner/tenants to a different energy savings program).
- 4. First Energy will schedule with a program contractor within 6 months. The contractor will provide a free audit of the building.
- 5. Contractor will schedule individually with tenants to perform the audit and installation at the same time.
- 6. Contractor will give proposal to owner with recommended common area measures.
- 7. Owner can pursue common area measures (at 20% of cost for each energy efficiency item). A new landlord agreement will be signed by the owner.
- 8. Payment for common area measures will go directly to the contractor.
- 9. Timeline of common area installation may depend upon contractor.
